









World War II Pacific Theater 1941-45

(Fleet tracks-blue Major assaults-yellow)






Major Japanese Bases at Start of WWII





Major Sea Battles 1942-43

Nomenclature

- US: (example F6F-3 Hellcat)
 - First letter F- type, fighter
 - First number 6- maker design number
 - Second letter F- manufacturer Grumman
 - Second number 3- model number
 - Hellcat- US name
- Japanese: (example A6M-5 Zeke Zero)
 - A- fighter
 - 6- design number
 - M- Mitsubishi
 - 5- model
 - Zeke- Japanese name
 - Zero- US name

Plane Types

- Fighter- 1 seat: pilot
- Dive Bomber- 2 seats: pilot & rear gunner
- Torpedo Bomber- 3 seats: pilot, bombardier, rear gunner
- Light Bomber- 2 engines, 2 pilots, ~6 crew
- Heavy Bomber- 4 engines, 2 pilots, 8 crew
- Float Planes- 1 engine, 2-3 crew
- Sea Planes/Amphibians- 2-4 engines, 2 pilots,
 ~10 crew

Plane Engines

- Most are radial engines w/ circular arranged cylinders
- One or two rows of odd number cylinders
- Two row, 14 cylinders most common
- Some later engines supercharged- water injected for more power
- Few inline or inverted V engines
- 3 or 4 blades- bigger planes have bigger engines and 4 blades
- Bent blades usually mean crash

B-25D Mitchell Crash Site Map






















