- Health

 - Preventative maintenance
 - China Study by T Colin Campbell
 - Exercise-both aerobic and strength
 - Lots of diving, hiking and travel possibilities
 - Being a good tourist is hard work

Things to Consider - 2

- Equipment Upgrades
 - Winch Rite (add-on electric winch)
 - Wireless windlass remote
- Changing Boats
 - Catamaran?
 - Motorsailor?
 - Trawler / Power Cruiser?
 - Downsizing the boat
 - More comfort / room
 - Storage convenience
 - Cost of cruising



Things to Consider - 3

- Adjusting Cruising Plans
 - Watch schedules 6 vs 4 hours (more sleep)
 - Cruising only during the "safe" season
 - Shorter hops
 - SE Asia, Mediterranean, Western Carib
 - Inland Cruising (US Waterway, Mediterranean canals, etc)
 - More Crew = More Rest, More Helping Hands

Things to Consider - 4

- Maintenance & Repair
 - Need skills, tools and repair parts
 - Beware of third world mechanics
 - Great 3rd world tradesmen
